Comparing pictures

Take some time to look at them.

Try to have useful phrases which can be used to compare any pictures.

Can you think of any of them now?

Both pictures show...

They are photos of ...

We can see ... in both photos.

Then, once you have said the general topic of both pictures ...

... you can point out their main differences or ...

You can describe both photos separately in a brief way, but ...

... emphazising their relation.

If you have started with the things they have in common, ...

... now finish stating their differences.

And, remember ...

Do's:

- say what the general topic is
- talk about both photos (people, objects, background)
- describe briefly both photos: what you see first, then what you can speculate (what's happening, what has just happened, what will happen next, feelings...)
- Point out the main differences
- Add personal opinion or advice
- Complete the tasks provided

Don't's:

- Don't focus on just one photo
- Don't talk very fast or very slow
- Don't repeat your favourite phrases all the time
- Don't be silent too much time
- Don't focus only in similarities/differences
- Don't forget about answering the questions/ follow the guidelines provided



- Talk about the different ways in which children use their free time today.
- Talk about the effects of these habits for friendship and relationships.
- Give your opinion about it.
