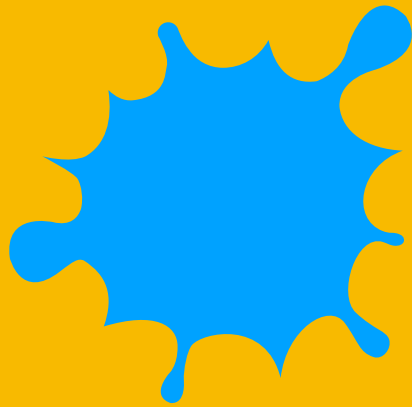


# PICTURE DESCRIPTION



Look at the picture and describe generally what you see. Answer the following question:

**What's in the picture?**



## EXAMPLES:

- \* It's a photo of a family in their house.
- \* In the picture we can see a living room and some people doing things.
- \* This is a picture of a house. We can see an adult and three children. They are in the living room.

**Add more information about the things in the picture (furniture and other details).**

**You need:**

- There is / are,
- the verb 'have got',
- the verb 'to be'
- and expressions like 'we can see'

## EXAMPLE:

- \* There are two parts in the living room. On the right there is a sofa, an auxiliary table and some shelves; on the left there is a table with chairs to eat and another shelf with books. The living room has got a lot of light because it has got two big windows.

Then, look again at the picture and describe who is in the picture and what they are doing.

Answer the following question:

**What's happening in the picture?**

**Describe the actions of the people in the picture.**

**You need:**

- Present continuous (to be + verb-ing)
- Verbs referring to actions

## EXAMPLE:

- \* The children are entertained. One of them is leaning on the sofa, he is looking at the other children. The other two children are playing a board game on a puff. They look relaxed. The adult in the photo, probably their dad, is carrying a plate. He is setting the table.
